Case Summary

On July 23, 2010, § 87(2)(b) filed a complaint with the CCRB by phone (encl. 4A-D). On July 24, 2009, he filed a duplicate complaint with the Internal Affairs Bureau, along with his wife and brother, § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b). IAB log 09-36425 was forwarded to and received by the CCRB on August 3, 2009 (encl. 5).

On July 22, 2009, at approximately 6:18 p.m., § 87(2)(b) was arrested at § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn by officers from the 75th Precinct and the 75th Precinct Detective Unit. The following allegations resulted:

Allegation A – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, SGT Christopher Barbieri used physical force against § 87(2)(b).

Allegation C – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, DET Michael Narsingh used physical force against § 87(2)(b).

Allegation F – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, DET Kenneth Anderson used physical force against § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(g).

Allegation B – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, PO Elliott McGinnis used physical force against § 87(2)(b).

Allegation D – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, PO Edward Mulhearn used physical force against § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(g).

Allegation E – Force-Chokehold: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, SGT Christopher Barbieri used a chokehold against § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g).

Allegation G – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, an officer struck § 87(2)(b) with an asp and handcuffs.

Allegation H – Abuse-Threat of force: En route to § 87(2)(b) an officer threatened § 87(2)(b) with the use of force. § 87(2)(g).

Allegation I – Force-Handcuffs too tight: At § 87(2)(b) an officer tightly handcuffed § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g).

Results of Investigation

Civilian Statement(s)

Complainants: § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b)

- § 87(2)(b) is § 87(2)(b) brother. § 87(2)(b) is § 87(2)(b) wife. Neither § 87(2)(b) nor § 87(2)(b) witnessed the incident and therefore, they could not provide a first-hand account of what occurred.

Complainant/Victim: § 87(2)(b)

- § 87(2)(b) is a § 87(2)(b) old black male, 5'10" tall, 190 lbs, with black dread locks and brown eyes; § 87(2)(b).

IAB statement

On July 24, 2010, § 87(2)(b) reported to the Internal Affairs Bureau that he had been beaten up by police officers and that he had sought medical treatment at § 87(2)(b) (encl. 5).

Telephone statement

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b). During the telephone statement, § 87(2)(b) described himself as "fighting for [his] life" during the incident (encl. 6).

Notice of Claim

On § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) filed a notice of claim. He alleged that he had been illegally searched and seized, punched and kicked in the face, head and body, and was also choked by police officers. As a result, § 87(2)(b) sustained physical injuries and emotional distress and is seeking damages of an unspecified amount (encl. 28A-D).

CCRB Testimony

On August 10, 2009, § 87(2)(b) was interviewed at the CCRB (encl. 7A-C). He was advised by his attorney, § 87(2)(b), not to discuss an incident that occurred on July 3, 2009, which involved his landlord, § 87(2)(b) who filed a complaint report against him. § 87(2)(b) also refused to discuss any charges pending against him.

On July 22, 2009, at approximately 6:00 p.m., § 87(2)(b) was inside of his home located at § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn. His sister-in-law, § 87(2)(b) and his two young children, ages § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b) were also home. § 87(2)(b) answered a knock at his front door and encountered DET Michael Narsingh and a white male officer, 6'0" tall, 180 lbs, with brown hair and wearing a shirt and tie. This officer was identified through investigation as PO Edward Mulhearn. § 87(2)(b) described DET Narsingh as an Indian male, 5'10" tall, 190 lbs, wearing a shirt and tie. DET Narsingh and PO Mulhearn asked § 87(2)(b) to step outside and he complied.

§ 87(2)(b) asked the officers whether they had a warrant for his arrest and stated that if they did not they were simply harassing him, and subsequently sat down on the door step. DET Narsingh called for backup officers to respond and two uniformed officers arrived within approximately five minutes. § 87(2)(b) described the uniformed officers as white males, one of which was 6'2" tall, 220 lbs, with black hair, and the other 5'11" tall, 200 lbs, both approximately

30 years old. These officers were identified through investigation as SGT Christopher Barbieri and PO Elliot McGinnis.

SGT Barbieri and PO McGinnis ran towards § 87(2)(b) who stood up as they approached. SGT Barbieri slammed § 87(2)(b) into a wall and he, PO McGinnis, DET Narsingh and PO Mulhearn punched § 87(2)(b) all over his body. SGT Barbieri placed § 87(2)(b) in a chokehold, and § 87(2)(b) bit into SGT Barbieri's forearm. SGT Barbieri forced § 87(2)(b) down onto the ground and placed him in handcuffs. § 87(2)(b) was hit in the temple with handcuffs, his hair was pulled from his scalp leaving a bald spot, an asp was pressed against his right leg causing him pain and he was stomped in the back; however, he could not determine which officer(s) took the above mentioned actions. None of the officers issued any commands. § 87(2)(b) denied fighting with the officers, albeit an earlier statement provided to the CCRB that he had been fighting for his life. § 87(2)(b) also denied resisting arrest.

§ 87(2)(b) head and body were placed into a sack, and he was put on a stretcher and placed inside of an ambulance. He could not breathe and complained aloud. An officer whom he could not see said, "If you don't stop acting, I'll make sure you can't breathe." § 87(2)(b) believed this particular officer escorted him to the hospital.

At the hospital, a white male officer, 5'10" tall, and wearing a uniform, squeezed § 87(2)(b) handcuffs tighter and caused his wrists to bleed. The hospital took X-rays of § 87(2)(b) wrists and legs and he was informed that his ankle had been sprained. He was released from the hospital and taken to the 75th Precinct stationhouse for arrest processing. On § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) sought follow-up medical treatment at § 87(2)(b) for infections to the abrasions sustained during the incident.

50-h Hearing

On § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) testified during a 50-h hearing. § 87(2)(a) Gen.Mun. §50-H(3), § 87(2)(g)

Arrest Photograph

§ 87(2)(b) arrest photograph indicated that he sustained an abrasion to his left cheekbone and redness to his left eye (encl. 10).

Other Evidence

§ 87(2)(b) wife, § 87(2)(b) took photos of his injuries with a digital camera on July 24, 2009. § 87(2)(b) provided the CCRB with copies: Photo 1 shows an abrasion to § 87(2)(b) left cheekbone. Photo 2 shows a bald patch on § 87(2)(b) scalp. Photo 3 shows redness to § 87(2)(b) left eye (encl. 8A-C).

Attempts to Contact Civilians

The undersigned investigator placed five phone calls to § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b) at the telephone numbers provided; however, voicemail messages could not be left. Two letters were mailed to § 87(2)(b) § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b) that were not returned to the CCRB by the United States Postal Service.

NYPD Statement(s):

Subject Officer: DET MICHAEL NARSINGH

- *DET Michael Narsingh is a § 87(2)(b) old Asian male, 5'11" tall, 200 lbs, with black hair and brown eyes. On July 22, 2009, he worked in plain clothes with an unidentified officer. He was assigned an unmarked vehicle.*

Memo Book

DET Narsingh's memo book indicated that at 6:18 p.m., § 87(2)(b) was arrested (encl. 12A-B).

Arrest Report

The arrest report indicates that on July 3, 2009, § 87(2)(b) threatened to kill § 87(2)(b) and an unknown individual. On July 22, 2009, § 87(2)(b) was arrested and charged § 87(2)(b). § 87(2)(b) physical condition was listed as EDP and he was admitted into § 87(2)(b) (encl. 13A-B).

CCRB Testimony

DET Narsingh was interviewed at the CCRB on April 1, 2010 (encl. 14A-B). On July 22, 2009, at approximately 6:18 p.m., DET Narsingh went to § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn to apprehend § 87(2)(b) on an open compliant § 87(2)(b). DET Narsingh and an officer, whom he did not recall, knocked on the door. The CCRB identified the other officer as PO Edward Mulhearn. § 87(2)(b) answered the door and DET Narsingh explained that he was there to arrest him for menacing. § 87(2)(b) punched the walls inside of the home and paced back and forth. DET Narsingh attempted to calm § 87(2)(b) down by talking to him and he stated, "Fuck you police. You're going to need a fucking army to take me down."

DET Narsingh radioed for back up officers to respond to the location and approximately ten marked patrol cars arrived, and an undetermined number of uniformed officers approached. § 87(2)(b) charged towards the officers and punched SGT Barbieri in the face. DET Narsingh grabbed § 87(2)(b) arms and placed one of his hands into handcuffs. Approximately five officers assisted in detaining § 87(2)(b) however, DET Narsingh did not recall exactly which officers were involved. DET Narsingh denied punching, kicking, or pulling § 87(2)(b) by the hair. He did not observe any officer punch or kick § 87(2)(b) pull his hair or slam him against a wall. DET Narsingh did not see SGT Barbieri place § 87(2)(b) in a chokehold and he did not see any officer hit § 87(2)(b) with their asp or handcuffs. § 87(2)(b) kicked, screamed and spit at the officers, and in their attempt to handcuff him, everyone fell to the ground. DET Narsingh did not see § 87(2)(b) bite SGT Barbieri.

The Emergency Services Unit responded to the location and placed § 87(2)(b) in a security bag. § 87(2)(b) continued to spit at the officers. DET Narsingh did not observe any injury to § 87(2)(b) when he was removed from the location by ambulance.

Subject Officer: SGT CHRISTOPHER BARBIERI

- *SGT Christopher Barbieri is a § 87(2)(b) old white male, 6'1" tall, 210 lbs, with brown hair and eyes. On July 22, 2009, he worked with PO Elliot McGinnis as the field training sergeant.*

Memo Book

SGT Barbieri's memo book entries indicate that at approximately 6:30 p.m. he responded to a call for assistance (encl. 15A-B).

Line of Duty Injury Report

§ 87(2)(b)

CCRB Testimony

SGT Barbieri was interviewed at the CCRB on April 26, 2010 (encl. 17A-B). On July 22, 2009, at approximately 6:30 p.m., SGT Barbieri and PO McGinnis arrived at § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn. They were the first officers to respond to the location after receiving a call for assistance from the Precinct Detective Unit. SGT Barbieri entered the building and observed two detectives explaining to § 87(2)(b) why he was under arrest. § 87(2)(b) appeared agitated and stated, "You better call a fucking army."

§ 87(2)(b) charged towards SGT Barbieri and punched him in the left shoulder. SGT Barbieri and PO McGinnis grabbed § 87(2)(b) arms, and through § 87(2)(b) resistance, they all fell to the ground. SGT Barbieri denied slamming § 87(2)(b) into a wall or placing him in a chokehold. § 87(2)(b) fell on top of SGT Barbieri's left forearm, bit into it and shook his head from left to right. SGT Barbieri punched § 87(2)(b) in the head with his right hand more than once until § 87(2)(b) released his bite.

§ 87(2)(b) kicked his legs and flailed his arms; however, the two detectives at the location did not become involved in the struggle to detain him. SGT Barbieri denied hitting § 87(2)(b) with handcuffs or an asp, and he did not see any officer hit § 87(2)(b) with those items. SGT Barbieri denied pulling any hair from § 87(2)(b) scalp and he did not observe any other officer take such action. SGT Barbieri was removed from the location by ambulance and taken to § 87(2)(b) to receive treatment for a bite wound.

Subject Officer: DET KENNETH ANDERSON

- *DET Kenneth Anderson is a § 87(2)(b) old white male, 5'10" tall, 185 lbs, with brown hair and eyes. On July 22, 2009, DET Anderson worked from 3:45 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. in plainclothes assigned to the detective squad.*

Memo Book

DET Anderson did not have any memo book entries regarding the incident (encl. 18A-B).

Line of Duty Injury Report

DET Anderson indicated that he sprained his left hand and felt pain to his neck while attempting to arrest § 87(2)(b) who assaulted him on the ground (encl. 19).

CCRB Testimony

DET Anderson was interviewed by the CCRB on April 1, 2010 (encl. 20A-B). On July 22, 2009, at approximately 6:18 p.m., DET Anderson responded to the location in response to DET Narsingh's call for assistance. DET Anderson observed SGT Barbieri and PO McGinnis holding § 87(2)(b) by his arms and falling onto the ground. DET Anderson attempted to help place § 87(2)(b) in handcuffs by grabbing his legs to prevent him from kicking; DET Anderson denied punching, kicking or hitting § 87(2)(b) with an instrument. DET Anderson did not observe any officer punch, kick, or hit § 87(2)(b) with an asp or handcuffs, and he did not observe anyone pull § 87(2)(b) hair. DET Anderson heard SGT Barbieri shout out that he had been bitten, but he did not see § 87(2)(b) bite SGT Barbieri. DET Anderson did not observe SGT Barbieri place § 87(2)(b)

§ 87(2)(b) in a chokehold. ESU officers arrived and placed § 87(2)(b) in a bag. DET Anderson did not observe any injury to § 87(2)(b). DET Anderson was taken to § 87(2)(b) for treatment to his wrist and he did not have any further interaction with § 87(2)(b).

Medical Records

FDNY Pre-Hospital Care Report

The report indicated that on § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) complained of pain to his head and face, and that he did not complain of any other distress. He did not mention his hair had been removed from his scalp. § 87(2)(b) was restrained by ESU. EMS personnel were informed that § 87(2)(b) had bitten two officers. § 87(2)(b) was escorted by an officer from the 75th Precinct with shield number 2835 (encl. 21A-B).

§ 87(2)(b)

The medical records indicated that on § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) stated he was hit in the face and groin, and that his hands and feet were stepped on by police officers, and that he was punched all over his body. As a result, he felt pain in his head, neck, wrists and legs. § 87(2)(b) did not report that his hair had been removed from his scalp. X-rays were taken of § 87(2)(b) right ankle and right wrist, and his left forearm, wrist and hand. A CT scan was taken of § 87(2)(b) head. The results indicated that § 87(2)(b) did not sustain any broken bones, fractures or internal injuries; however, he did sustain mild swelling to his left face and left wrist, and bruising and abrasions to his shoulders and wrists. § 87(2)(b) was treated with Toradol, an anti-inflammatory and Motrin for pain relief (encl. 22A-L).

§ 87(2)(b)

The medical records indicated that on § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) stated he was assaulted by police officers and that he complained of continued body aches to his neck, ankle and right side of the face. § 87(2)(b) did not report that his hair had been removed from his scalp. § 87(2)(b) left eye was red. § 87(2)(b) was diagnosed with musculoskeletal pain, subconjunctival hematoma and an ankle sprain. He was prescribed Motrin for pain relief (encl. 23A-F).

NYPD Document(s)

SPRINT W11561

The SPRINT report indicates that at 6:19 p.m., DET Narsingh requested additional officer assistance at § 87(2)(b) where § 87(2)(b) was described as a violent EDP. At 6:22 p.m., ESU officers were requested to respond. At 6:24 p.m., EMS was requested to respond to the location because two members of service were injured. One officer was taken to § 87(2)(b), another was taken to § 87(2)(b) and § 87(2)(b) was taken to § 87(2)(b) (encl. 24A-F).

75th Precinct Detective Squad roll call

The roll call indicates that Detectives Anderson and Narsingh and PO Mulhearn was assigned to team 2 and worked from 3:45 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. on July 22, 2010 (encl. 25A-B).

75th Precinct Detective Squad movement log

The movement log indicates that at 5:35 p.m., DET Narsingh and PO Mulhearn were in route to § 87(2)(b) (encl. 26).

Summons/Arrest for Incident and Disposition

Status of Civil Proceedings

- On § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) filed a Notice of Claim with the City of New York claiming excessive physical force was used against him and he is seeking an unspecified amount of damages as redress (encl. 28B-E).
- As of § 87(2)(b), no payment has been made on § 87(2)(b) notice of claim (encl. 30I).

Civilian(s) Criminal History

Civilian(s) CCRB History

- This is the first CCRB complaint filed by § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(b) and/or § 87(2)(b) (encl. 3A-C).

Subject Officer(s) CCRB History

- SGT Barbieri has been a member of the service for seven years and there are no substantiated CCRB allegations against him (encl. 2A).
- DET Narsingh has been a member of the service for thirteen years and there are no substantiated allegations against him (encl. 2B).
- DET Anderson has been a member of the service for sixteen years and there are no substantiated allegations against him (encl. 2C).
- PO McGinnis resigned from the NYPD on January 6, 2010 (encl. 32H).
- PO Mulhearn resigned from the NYPD on June 24, 2010 (encl. 32I).

Conclusion

Identification of Subject Officer(s)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

Investigative Findings and Recommendations

Allegation A – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, SGT Christopher Barbieri used physical force against § 87(2)(b)

Allegation C – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, DET Michael Narsingh used physical force against § 87(2)(b)

Allegation F – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, DET Kenneth Anderson used physical force against § 87(2)(b):

§ 87(2)(b) alleged that SGT Barbieri, and Detectives Narsingh and Anderson punched and kicked him while effectuating his arrest. During his sworn testimony, § 87(2)(b) denied resisting arrest or fighting with the officers; however, he acknowledged that he had bitten SGT Barbieri. In his telephone statement, § 87(2)(b) said he had been fighting for his life. SGT Barbieri punched § 87(2)(b) in the head more than once to get § 87(2)(b) to release the bite of his forearm. The officers described § 87(2)(b) to have punched and kicked at them and in response they grabbed his arms and legs. § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

SGT Barbieri and DET Anderson were injured during the arrest and they each filed Line of Duty Reports. DET Narsingh indicated on § 87(2)(b) arrest report that he was an EDP and § 87(2)(b) was charged § 87(2)(b). § 87(2)(g) Patrol Guide Procedure 203-11, which guides an officer's use of force states, "Only the amount of force necessary to overcome resistance will be used to effect an arrest," § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

Allegation B – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, PO Elliott McGinnis used physical force against § 87(2)(b)

Allegation D – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, PO Edward Mulhearn used physical force against § 87(2)(b)

§ 87(2)(b) alleged that PO McGinnis ran towards him and immediately began to punch him all over his body. He also alleged that he had been punched by PO Mulhearn as well. The CCRB was unable to receive officer testimony from Officers McGinnis or Mulhearn due to the fact that they are no longer members of service. PO McGinnis resigned from the NYPD on January 6, 2010, and PO Mulhearn resigned from the NYPD on June 24, 2010. SGT Barbieri and Detectives Narsingh and Anderson were unable to provide witness accounts of the actions taken by Officers McGinnis and Mulhearn. § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)

Allegation E – Force-Chokehold: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, SGT Christopher Barbieri used a chokehold against § 87(2)(b)

§ 87(2)(b) consistently alleged to the CCRB that SGT Barbieri placed him in a chokehold, § 87(2)(a) Gen.Mun. §50-H(3); however, he did not make the allegation during any of the statements provided to medical personnel. SGT Barbieri denied placing § 87(2)(b)

§ 87(2)(b) in a chokehold and he stated that during the struggle to place § 87(2)(b) into handcuffs, he and § 87(2)(b) fell to the ground where § 87(2)(b) fell on top of his forearm and bit into it. § 87(2)(b) acknowledged biting SGT Barbieri and stated it was in response to being choked. Detectives Narsingh and Anderson both denied observing SGT Barbieri place § 87(2)(b) in a chokehold. § 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(g)

§ 87(2)(g)

Allegation G – Force-Physical Force: At § 87(2)(b) in Brooklyn, an officer struck § 87(2)(b) with an asp and handcuffs.

Allegation H – Abuse-Threat of force: En route to § 87(2)(b) an officer threatened § 87(2)(b) with the use of force.

§ 87(2)(b) alleged that he was hit in the head with handcuffs and that an asp was pressed into his right leg causing him pain. He acknowledged that he could not see which officer took the above actions. He also alleged that an officer threatened him with the use of force inside of the ambulance; however, he also did not see this officer.

SPRINT W11561 indicates that officers from the 75th Precinct, 75th Precinct Detective Unit and Emergency Services Unit responded to the location. None of the officers interviewed admitted to taking part in the alleged actions and they did not observe any other officers do so.

Allegation I – Force-Handcuffs too tight: At § 87(2)(b) an officer tightly handcuffed § 87(2)(b):

§ 87(2)(b) alleged that the officer who escorted him to the hospital tightened his handcuffs and caused pain and lacerations to his wrists. He described this officer as a white male, 5'10" tall, and wearing a uniform. SGT Barbieri and Detectives Narsingh and Anderson denied escorting § 87(2)(b) to the hospital and were not aware who was assigned the task. A FDNY Pre-Hospital Care Report indicates that § 87(2)(b) was escorted by an officer from the 75th Precinct with shield 2835. A search of CTS revealed that there are no male officers assigned to the 75th Precinct, the 75th Precinct Detective Squad or the Emergency Services Unit (commands from which officers responded according to SPRINT W11561) with shield number 2835 or anything similar. CTS revealed PO Paul Guzman, a Hispanic male officer who is assigned to Patrol Borough Brooklyn South, has a similar shield number of 28358. § 87(2)(b), § 87(2)(g)
